2) Hispanic-Serving Health Professions Schools-Cecilia Morales.

Cecilia is a Psychology major who had an opportunity to submit an abstract to the Hispanic Serving Health Professions Schools. The acceptance of her abstract allowed her to present to the National Institute of Health. Cecilia reported gaining valuable insight on the importance of networking, in-depth genetic research, and working with other professors.

Discussion: Ms. Hernandez asked the student about the benefit and take-away from her trip. Ms. Morales reported that she was impressed with the genetic testing taking place in Mexico City. Researchers are able to breakdown the percentages of a person ethnic makeup. Ms. Morales also has a deeper appreciation for mentoring.

Ms. Morales reported that the research was based on low income Latino women in Long Beach, to ascertain barriers and motivators to exercise. Some of the barriers were domestic duties such cleaning and taking care of the kids. The motivators were based on educating the kids about the importance of exercise and proper nutrition. A 12 step program was devised to help them manage stress, set goals and incorporate exercise into their daily routine.

- 4) 15th Biennial Conference of the Society for Community Research & Action-Cassandra Gearhart-Massachusetts.
 - Ms. Gearhart is a Graduate student in the Psychology department studying psychological research. She's reviewing possible Ph. D. programs as well seeking a mentor. Ms. Gearhart currently works in a research lab where they deal with violence against women. The question presented, "Should law enforcement apologize to survivors for the rape kit backlog?" The topic embraces a broader study of a backlog of rape kits that has emerged in recent years. They interviewed 97 participates ranging from law enforcement, academia, rape crisis advocates, medical staff and survivors. The culmination of the analysis was further broken down in quantitative and qualitative resulting in a second question, "Should law enforcement officers apologize to survivors?"

8. OLD CORPORATE BUSINESS

- A. Revised Board of Control Working Rules
 - 1) Senate Representative doesn't have designees, only the President and Vice President. A designee must be appointed or an elected ASI official.
 - 2) There are no sub-committees under approval of minutes. This will be removed from the agenda.
 - 3) Change ASI Recording Secretary to, ASI Department Secretary.
 - 4) A Majority vote is necessary to make additions to the agenda. Any additions must conform to education code 89305.5. It has to be an emergency item.
 - 5) New wording: The Spring Allocation process for the Board of Control shall devise and publish each year the process to be used to determine the amount of the Spring Allocation awarded.
 - 6) New wording: ASI policy statement, not manual. They aren't numbered so there is no need to reference the number.
 - 7) New wording: personnel actions did not need to be capitalized. State the title of the policy and the number of the standard of procedure. It clarifies the language.
 - 8) In the Human Resource Management Committee there is no need to repeat their working rules in BOC working rules. Reference that the Human Resource Committee acts in those areas that they have responsibility for as designated in its working rules. Human Resource Management Committee (HRMC) working rules were deleted because they are in another document.

C. Executive Director's Report

The following items:

- 1) Missing three managers has left him wearing several hats, so he's a little overwhelmed.
- 2) New Leadership in the division wants to shake things up so he has to make adjustments.
- A management review with the Child Development Center has uncovered a number of concerns that need his immediate attention. These issues will require him stepping back from Student Government.
- 4) Carmen Taylor would like to find space in USU to accommodate the Cultural Center-Student Resource Center. Logistically this is a challenging endeavor.
- 5) Year-end closing is quickly approaching, but thus far they are in good shape.
- 6) Initial consultation with Ceridian Consulting to discuss the new phase of the Human Resource Information system. The staff will attend a huge Convention in Las Vegas.
- 7) Suggests that the Board moves cautiously regarding the Genocide Awareness Program (GAP) and that a robust discussion is needed on the topic. The proposal made reference to "trigger warnings" which are a controversial psychological concept that need to be thoroughly discussed.
- 8) Reason to call a special meeting of BOC prior to the August meeting. He has some policy amendments he would like to address. The special meeting of BOC will be held on July 21, 2015.
