- B. Discussion Item: 2021-2022 Associated Students Inc. Operating Budget (1st Reading)
  - The draft 2021-2022 Operating Budget is for 11 unique departments and activities funded primarily by the Associated Students fee.
  - Student concerns and objectives were reflected in the budget priorities.

- Constant consideration is being given to changing economic and programmatic impacts resulting from the COVID- 19 global pandemic.
- There are continued losses in commercial revenue, increased facility operations costs, and continued uncertainty related to how alternative university instruction and programmatic closures will ultimately impact revenues and expenses.
- Previous long-term existing priorities remain, including the need to meet increasing fixed costs, compliance with increasing minimum wage obligations, maintenance of outdated facilities, and investment into employee benefits and retirement obligations.

## Budget Opportunities, Challenges & Operating Priorities

- Decrease in Student Headcount: based on a projected 2% enrollment decrease from last year
- Minimum Wage Increases and Repopulation: will increase January 1, 2020 bringing the minimum wage to \$15 per hour

## **Operating Adjustments**

- Capital Outlay: addresses deferred maintenance and facility upgrades primarily at the Isabel Patterson Child Development Center
- Isabel Patterson Child Development Center: represents a 30% decrease in overall activity from last year; salary adjustment for four program teachers
- Reserves: investment in the overall fiscal health to assist in managing future economic downturns
- Travel and Student and Staff Professional Development: restored limited internal travel and professional development funds; restored Study Abroad scholarship funding
- Voluntary Employees' Beneficiary Association (VEBA) Contributions: recommending an investment to fund
- Student Organization Activities: restore funding for student organization programs, competitions, travel, and administrative costs

## Revenue and Support Detail

- Revenue from Student Fees
  - Associated Students Fees
    The 2021-2022 Associated Students budget includes net revenues of \$6,730,800, consisting of \$5,273,475 in fees based on enrollment projections provided by the CSULB Office of Budget and University Services, and \$1,457,325 in enterprise revenue.
