Mr Jarvis said that 911 can't self-incriminate you, it's federal law. Senator Marvin told Senator Kling to talk to SOAR Director, there is a video on the Pomona case. Mr. Brett Waterfield asked Senator Kling if he has spoken to ATOD on the services they provide and also talk to Heidi Berka and Linda Pena. Senator David said no, not yet. Senator Nikki said to work with the Health Center, Student Health Advisory Committee and to contact the family to see if they are comfortable with the resolution being in his name. Senator Devin is in full support but logistically, how do we reach out to 37,000 students? Senator David responded with the freshman University 101 course that everyone has to take. Senator Devin asked if this would be mandatory. Senator David said yes. Senator Kelsey said reaching out to the student organizations on campus would hopefully get the word out. Vice President Miriam this is a larger issue, how do we make the communication easier with police? Mr. Richard Haller said judiciary did know your rights workshops series informing police, and tenant issues. Senator Nikki we need to work with campus groups verses forming new committees so we can strengthen the relationships with other organizations and departments such as Judiciary, Health Center, Student Organizations and CSULB Police.
