6. ANNOUNCEMENTS FROM THE CHAIR

VP Hernandez yielded her time to Mary Ann Takemoto who spoke about the Student Health Services Fee Increase Proposal

- Executive Order 943: Student Health Centers shall be established and maintained to facilitate the retention of students matriculated in state-supported programs of the university and to enhance the academic performance of students through accessible and high quality medical care, public health prevention programs, and educational programs.
- Current health services fee: \$45/semester \$90/academic year
- Facility fee: \$3/semester \$6/academic year
- Fee in place since 2005
- The need for the fee increase: No adjustment for price level increase
- \$90 fee set in 2005 would need to be adjusted to \$110 to simply hold the same value in 2015
- Increase in labor costs, especially for health care professionals
- Increase in risk management costs
- Increase in costs of medications, supplies
- What is covered by the SHS Fee: General office visits (no per visit charge), Urgent Care, X-ray Services, Laboratory Services, Pharmacy, Health Promotion and Education, Sports Medicine, Reproductive Care, Case Manager
- The fee increase would cover: Maintaining Current Level of Staffing and Services, Increase in Mental Health Services, Psychiatry, Additional Counselors, Increase in Wellness/Health Promotion, Stress Management, Yoga, Specialty Clinics, Dermatology, Allergies
- Fee increase proposed: Total Proposed Increase: \$35/semester or \$70/year
- This increase will be phased in over two years: Year 1: \$20/semester or \$40/year Year 2: Additional \$15/semester
- This fee increase is proposed to go into effect Spring 2017
