# C. Executive Business

1) 2016-2017 ASI Consolidated Operating Budget (presentation and 1st reading)

Mr. Haller said that senate will be looking at the budget for next year, and reviewed the following breakdown:

- Student enrollment will increase by 2.71% and the USU fee will increase by 2.37%.
- Income from leases will increase due to lease of additional space to CSULB and changes to EO-1000 implementation.
- The number of positions in the USU will increase by 1.0 FTE position. there will be no cost of living adjustments on merit increases
- Stipends will be eliminated for Judiciary and Cabinet positions
- Error in calculating net fee income resulted in additional \$27,977 that has not been allocated
- The areas that aren't funded are the minimum wage increase, restoration of stipends for Judiciary, Cabinet, Lobby Corps, and Government Elections Office.
- Budget is balanced
- Proposed revenue= Proposed expenditures. If you want to increase one area, you will need to decrease another.
- 2nd reading is scheduled for April 20th, 3rd & final reading is scheduled for April 27th

## 11. REPORTS

A. Resolution Presentation: CSULB Dream Center

This resolution stresses the work that ASI pushed to create this center on this campus. Having a space in the USU (USU-309) to complete their work has really helped them. We have about 900 undocumented students on campus and this center has helped and served about 200 students so far. They are able to support students with things such as financial aid and work permits.

- B. Academic Senate Update: ASI Academic Senators Chachra and Le
  - Endorsed San Jose State University's resolution to "Implement the Recommendations of the Neutral Fact-Finder's Report and Avert [the faculty] Strike" before the strike was postponed.
  - Directed International Education Committee's attention to international students.
  - Advocated for President's presence at the second forum before the Academic Senate.

- International student scholarship: Rationale: predicaments and challenges.
- International Student Scholarship: meetings with the International Education Committee, ASI executives, President Conoley, and Dr. Joshee Dean of CCPE to seek financial support.
- Campus Climate Survey: rationale: an Assessment of ourselves. Reaching out to our students.
- Campus Climate Survey: met with Prof. Nielan Barnes and the Campus Climate Committee on April 13.
- Accessing the recent incident involved the ICE: requested the report from our campus police.

## C. Not Alone @ The Beach: Dr. Jeane Caveness & Candice Simons Davis

- Not Alone @ The Beach is a \$200,000 grant that is good for 2 years. This grant creates a CCRT (Campus community response team) with their partners on and off campus for sexual assault victims. This grant creates more trauma informed services for students on campus who have survived sexual assault.
- Some of their CCRT Off Campus partners are YWCA-GLA and Interval House
- Some of their CCRT On Campus partners are ASI, athletics, CAPS, EOP, Office of Equity and Diversity, Residential Life

## D. Jose Salazar, ASI President of the Associated Students

- Presented to a group from Cypress College that plans to transfer to CSULB, they talked about student life and ASI collaborations
- April 8th, he attended a scholarship lunch with the 49er Shops, Inc.
- RPP committee met on the day that the school had the compromise with the faculty on campus, they talked about the budget
