3. INVOCATION

Invocation was presented by Chair Academic Senate and CSULB Professor of English Dr. Norbert Schurer. He read a quote from the bible Ephesians 4:31 that said,

“Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamour, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice: and be kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you.”

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Confidential Agenda Items to Board Members Only

Paul requests us to be kind to others, even though it isn't as easy as it sounds. Dr. Shurer argues that he means it as an ideal as something we should strive for as imperfect human beings. Focus on the good in one another even if we have had experiences where we think we have been wronged. We should make ourselves humble and make ourselves feel vulnerable by being kind and tender hearted. This is difficult because we all want to lash out when we're attacked, and we feel we're always right and do not need to apologize for anything. Keep being kind to each other even as God and Christ forgave you.

Dr. Shurer talks about the Fall election cycle and how it is full of hurtful language and badgering and how this type of behavior is being reflected on the CSULB campus. He hopes that we will be able to overcome our obstacles and be able to speak to each other forgivingly and kindly. That is the only way we can make a better world.

A. Legislative Business

- 1) Action Item: SR #2017-03: Resolution in Support of Maintaining Current CNSM Science Learning Center and Mobile Science Museum Programs (1st and 2nd Reading)
- 2) **(M) Gomez (S) Kim to approve SR #2017-03: Resolution in Support of Maintaining Current CNSM Science Learning Center and Mobile Science Museum Programs (1st and 2nd Reading)**

Sen. Elasmar speaks about the resolution regarding the CNSM Science Learning Center and Mobile Science Museum Programs. The resolution is a response to the changes that are coming to the Science Learning Center, and invited the Director of the SLC, Mr. Jim McKibben, to talk about the background of the program and answer questions. Sen. Elasmar hopes the resolution will be passed before the Director of the SLC retires on September 30th, 2016.

Mr. McKibben talks about the SLC and how it has been a part of the CSULB Science program for more than 30 years. Mr. McKibben had spoken with Dean Laura Kingsford about the future of the SLC at two points in the past month. At the first meeting, Dean Kingsford had assured Mr. McKibben that the SLC would stay with the science program at CSULB. However, at the second meeting, Dean Kingsford asked Mr. McKibben to find a new home for the animals in the SLC, including a 7-gallon reef aquarium, and to also get rid of the Mobile Science Museum.

Mr. McKibben asks the Senate to talk to the President and Dean Kingsford about keeping the CNSM SLC and MSM at CSULB. There will be an open forum to discuss the future of these programs on September 22nd @ 9:00am in The Beach Auditorium. He wishes that the SLC would return to its position in the past years, with a full time director who is not a part of faculty. He also wishes that there will be paid part time employees instead of part time volunteers because there were times where Mr. McKibben was the only employee taking the MSM around Southern California.

Anthony T. Liaw Memorial Fund started by Jim McKibben, establishing Anthony Liaw's memory in order to support the CSULB SLC and MSM. Anthony Liaw was a student at CSULB with a degree in Marine Biology, who volunteered full time with Mr. McKibben at the SLC and MSM. The funds from his memorial fund have been used to sustain the MSM in order to function.

Mr. McKibben also highlights the affects that the SLC and MSM have had on student volunteers. He had a student that was a volunteer for two years who had found a prestigious internship at the Los Angeles Zoo and she had stood out from the other applicants because of her work at the SLC and MSM. The hands on experience, recommendations, and overall information she received from this

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program helped her and others who have volunteered in the past to get experience.

VP Vournas asks what portion of the SLC is funded from the grants and donations and if there is any help in funding from the university funds.

Mr. McKibben responds that during the last 6 months there has been special funding coming from President Connelly, along with part time volunteers and paid part time employees (~10 hours/week). The main funding “keeping the fish fed” is coming from the Liaw endowment fund (\$50,000+) and has received donations for 23 years from the Alumni Association.

CNSM Dean has sent designees to the meeting, Lisa Martin Hansen – Chair of Science Education.

Sen. Alonzo asks Lisa what changes she would like to see in the program. Mrs. Hansen responds that they are trying to figure out what will happen to the SLC and MSM when there is no one in charge, they will try to make a plan of what to do with the space.

Sen. Gomez has concerns about what will happen when the director retires, will the SLC and MSM still be available or will the students at schools lose the opportunity to see and interact with these animals.

Chair Lisa Martin Hansen says that when there is no director, as the current director is retiring, they will have to temporarily close the SLC and MSM until they have a solution. However, the projected task force believes it will open again in Spring 2017 and calls it more of a ‘delay’.

Sen. Elasmr says she wants the Senate to come together and make a resolve that talks about looking into finding a full time director for the SLC and MSM that is fully dedicated to running these programs. It is also important for them to run the grants and finding funding to supply the programs. She also wants to see another resolve increasing support for the SLC to increase the outside of CNSM involvement by the University to expand the program.

VP Vournas explains that they want to carry the resolution as is and if the Senate members have any concerns or want to change anything in the resolution, to contact Sen. Elasmr or Sen. Rincon. At the 3rd and Final reading, the resolution will be read in its entirety and finalized version.

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Candidate Simran Nath believes she is qualified with excellent time management skills, along with working part time, can also maintain school work and participate in extracurricular activities. She says that she has the ability to communicate with different types of people (age, gender). She has a genuine passion to help people and makes her qualified for this position as Secretary for Disability Affairs. She expressed that even though she has no prior experience, she is a quick learner, can multitask, willing to learn, willing to go out into unfamiliar positions, confident public speaker, and doing anything she can to do the best at the position.

VP Vournas asks the candidate why she wants to be the Secretary for Disability Affairs.

Candidate Simran responds that she loves to help people and she likes knowing that she has done something to help someone else. She says that knowledge is a major part in doing the right thing, but not knowing how to.

Sen. Jurado asks the candidate what are some of her goals for being Secretary.

Candidate Simran responds that her goals would be to allow as much information to go throughout campus on how to help students with disabilities and spread awareness of disabilities

Sen. Wong questions Candidate Simran's availability for the meetings, which are held on Mondays @ 10:00am. The candidate's availability states she is only available until 11:00, however, some meetings may last more than an hour. Candidate states that she has class starting at 11:00am and cannot stay past that time.

Sen. Musman asks how long the meetings for Disability Affairs are.

VP Vournas responds that the meetings are usually an hour and a half long. They recall sitting in a cabinet position for those meetings but was not able to attend the meetings in Spring semester. They said they do not vote on subjects but it is just the reports section. They were able to not attend the meetings but it did not affect their cabinet position.

Sen. Flores says because of the 100 Classes in 100 Days, students have come up to her regarding the

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IPCDC with concerns and Sen. Flores replied that she would do what she could to see their concerns. She thinks that to be able to do so, she would need more information and more involvement with the IPCDC. She would want to help students with their concerns and giving them the answers that they need is what she campaigned for when she was voted to the Senate.

Sen. Alonzo says she wants to help others and talking to the students and bringing awareness to the IPCDC, and helping to spread awareness about it.

Mr. Haller says that the children in the IPCDC range from 6 months – 7 years old. He says that if either Senator has a focus on post-secondary children, then the IPCDC will not be of relevance, but both Senate members are focusing on early childhood.
