 - 1) Discussion Item: Ethnic Studies Report

Secretary for Cultural Diversity, Victoria Villa discusses the Ethnic Studies Report, which was started by CSULB's department of Africana Studies. Results of a study between 22 California State Universities, including students, staff, classes, etc.). Results were presented to Chancellor White who asked that the study be commissioned. Reports spanning 8-10 years, history of Ethnic Studies and how it developed from student advocacy at Universities. It also discusses why it's necessary, the faculty and how they reach out to students, and 10 recommendations for the continued excellence of the CSU system.

Victoria wants the Senate to pay attention to page 2 of the Ethnic Studies Report, where it shows the category of Ethnic Studies and Sen. Yasmin brought to her attention that Middle Eastern Studies was not included. There is a section under "Multicultural Studies", however, there is no discussion of Middle Eastern studies. Victoria believes that, at the time we are in now, it is essential to have Middle Eastern studies, and has looked into other university's programs and there are no schools that have a program with Middle Eastern studies.

Victoria says that because we started this report and there is no mention of Middle Eastern Studies, this reflects in a negative way towards our University because it does not reflect how we treat our students or staff. We are not actively representing a population and that is saying that they are not important.

VP Vournas says that they will go through all of the recommendations in the next meeting and the Senate members will vote on which of the recommendations to support. VP Vournas will then write a resolution with the Senate's position on all of them. They searched the document for keywords "Middle" and "East", and there is no mention of those words in the entire document.

VP Vournas clarifies for the Senate that there is no major for Middle Eastern Studies, however, there is a class on Arabic and a major Religious Studies, which has a section on the Middle East.

Victoria clarifies that the recommendation wants schools to turn the GE Requirements into options so that students have the chance to take Ethnic studies courses.

VP Vournas states that they want to make a separate resolution on Middle Eastern Studies because it requires more attention and more data to support the ideas.

VP Elasmara states that there are issues that are occurring now and affecting students. One of her classmates was required to take a course, but they stopped offering a class on the history of the Middle East, but instead, they offered her a course on Silk Roads. Sen. Elasmara compared this to having to take a Biochemistry course, but instead being told to take a General Chemistry course.
