Logan and I spoke briefly the other day about the things we see can change within CSSA to improve not only efficiency, but the way in which communication and funding operates within the board. Below are a list and brief description of what we will be discussing this weekend with the board at Cal Poly SLO and what our improvements are:

- Creating a bylaw that stipulates whenever a "danger" or "emergency" is to face the CSU system and the chancellor makes CSSA Executives aware of it, the Execs will have to notify every campus AS, ASI or Student Body president within 24 hours of the information. Ex: tuition increase.
- Having annual CSSA staff evaluations by the board and ensuring that they are aware of CSSA policies and what they entail.
- Establishing the Mission Statement that CSSA is an extension of CSU's Student Body Governments and a liaison between the CSU Chancellors office and the CSU campuses.
- Starting the conversation of mid-year re-election of student officers and/or evaluations.
- Putting a cap on the travel funds that CSSA members can use and if they want to use more than what is received then they have to request more funds with at the minimum of 2/3rds vote from the board.
- Creating a clear policy on what the board can do in regards to the budget and reallocating funds.
- Advocating to have more student trustees a part of the CSU Board of Trustees.

This is a start of how we view CSSA can begin to improve their functions.

In regards to the possible tuition increase, today I met with Dale and we discussed some ideas about how we wish to move forward with what our campus is going to be doing. As of right now I do not want to start planning out to much information until we get all the facts from CSSA this weekend and from the CSU BOT meeting next week.

After we receive more facts, we will follow up next Friday to see what we have and solidify all of our resources. For now this is what we know, we have 7 weeks until the CSUBOT convene again to vote on the budget with the tuition increase. During this time, we will be focusing our efforts on educating our campus on why this is happening and how we want as many students to go out to that meeting and protest.
