  - The university only uses pesticides in weed management when manual removal is not feasible.
  - Only certified applicator technicians who are trained through the California Department of Pesticide Regulation apply pesticides on campus.
  - ➤ We are in the process of implementing a new approach to weed management that could include using pest-resistant landscaping, biological controls, and species-specific pesticides to reduce the number of pesticides used on campus

## 12. CLOSING COMMENTS

Dale Lendrum, student: spoke about accountability and self-care while serving in ASI; suggested having open forums on key issues; commended board for all the good work they do.

Deng: voiced concern for a student-reported incident of racism made to the Office of Cultural Affairs and Diversity, where it was recorded, brushed off, and professor had access to complaints made; voiced need to evaluate complaint reporting process so that students are protected.

Bose: encouraged board to complete Campus Climate Survey; 6.5% of students have responded.

Almahdi: regarding Covid-19: increased sanitization measures are in place; requested everyone to be patient for faculty as they have to make a lot of new accommodations; campus will be open; planning to postpone or cancel large scale events; more information will be available tomorrow; Zoom is an online option for everyone; thank staff on campus next few weeks for keeping everything clean and working in these situations

Triska: want to ensure that Senate has the opportunity to be involved in any new/revision policy conversation: for example, the ASI Student Travel Fund.

Velasquez: The chancellor's office gave us a statement regarding travel which we are following which states to suspend any non-essential travels through May 2020; in conversation with the EOC; it is a community put together by the university; they are working closely with CDC and our university police.

Ortiz: Will Senate meet next week?

Almahdi: as of now, yes. But check emails as things are changing rapidly

Deng: having an interview this Friday with the Governor's Office for the CSU Board of Trustees position; would like to talk about CSULB systemic issues; please contact me regarding any issues.

Ware: ASI Business Office will be open 9am-5pm until April 20<sup>th</sup>.
