#### B. Legislative Business

 Action Item: Approval of Temporary Student Organization Funding Policy
 Treasurer Andrade reviewed the temporary policy which recognizes COVID-19's effects on university
 operations, instruction, and programming.

The California State University (CSU) system has placed a hold on all campus, student, and third-party events through January 1, 2021, and all travel through June 30, 2021. Due to these restrictions, ASI programming has been restricted and will be facilitated virtually, where possible.

This temporary policy will be monitored and updated as needed. Should the campus return to in-

person instruction and on-campus programming, ASI's previous funding policies will apply, and ASI will update all student organizations with information on how to access funding.

#### **New Temporary Policy**

Student Travel Grants: Consistent with CSU guidelines, no student travel grants can be considered for the 2020/2021 academic year.

Student Research Grants: Applications for student research grants will still be considered. The Board of Control will scrutinize student research applications to ensure they meet health and safety guidelines, and to ensure they do not require travel out of the region.

Student Organization Grants: No new program grants will be considered until further notice. Grant awards previously issued through the spring grant allocation process for summer and fall 2020 events cannot be used as proposed due to the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and related restrictions on in-person, campus events, and the restrictions on group gatherings. Those student organizations are encouraged to consider alternative events in virtual formats, and the ASI Board of Control has issued a standard \$300 award for each student organization that was awarded a grant for a summer or fall 2020 program or event. This \$300 award is being made available to these organizations on a reimbursement basis via a grant account. Student organizations do not need to reapply for these awards through a new grant application or Program Change Amendment, they simply need to seek reimbursement by working with your Student Life and Development (SLD) advisor.
