- E. Information Item: Eugenia Kim, Center for International Education Time Certain 4:10 p.m.
  - Due to constantly evolving situation with Covid, immigration, and General Elections, regulations and guidelines are up for change
  - Current international students studying in U.S. are studying online
  - Study abroad students
  - Those students will have to take a hybrid course
  - Dean Dr. Jeet Joshee will provide updates, as needed

Hossain: what support and resources are study abroad students receiving (i.e. hotspots)?

Kim: does not know; challenge is in time zones and software downloads that students cannot download.

Alderete Gonzalez: have faculty been accommodating to the time zone challenge.

Kim: of the three students that have reported time zone challenge, most of their faculty have been accommodating, but a few haven't. For spring 2021, students will be asked to enroll in asynchronous course.

Bose: regarding time zone concerns about fall 2020 exams, the university isn't in the position to request faculty reschedule exams, so students are being encouraged to explore asynchronous classes; spring schedule will list classes as synchronous and asynchronous, in order to assist class selection.

Gevorkian: suggested faculty extend testing from one day to possibly more.

Austin: how can students switch to asynchronous since the deadline has passed?

Bose: students cannot switch/add classes since deadline has passed, so option is for students is to withdraw.

  - As of Friday, 546 responses received
  - Results
    - Majority reported a slightly bad experience

    - Student difficulty with virtual format
    - Instructor struggling with adapting to virtual instruction
    - Staying motivated
    - Communication barriers: lagging email and communicating with peers (exploring new methods of communication and platforms)
    - > Test format: lock down browser
    - Invasion of privacy
    - Increased workload
  - Highlights
    - Many were understanding of faculty's transition and technological barriers
    - > Appreciate recorded lectures
    - > Appreciate available university resources
